Geographers Conduct Coastal and Economic Fieldwork at Walton-on-the-Naze

Last week, our Year 11 Geography students had the opportunity to participate in a three-day field trip to Walton-on-the-Naze, with different groups attending on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. As part of their GCSE studies, students conducted hands-on fieldwork on the beach, investigating coastal processes and erosion.

Following their coastal studies, students explored the seaside town to assess economic activity within the town. The research and evidence gathered during the trip will be an important component of their final examination grade, offering them practical insights to support their classroom learning.

Monday: <i>Remembrance Day</i>	Commemorate (Verb) <i>Definition:</i> To honour the memory of someone or something, often with a ceremony. <i>Example:</i> On Remembrance Day, people gather to commemorate those who have served in the military.
Tuesday: Odd Socks Day	Unconventional: (Adjective) <i>Definition:</i> Not based on or conforming to what is generally done or believed. <i>Example:</i> Odd Socks Day encourages students to celebrate unconventional fashion choices.
Wednesday: <i>World Kindness Day</i>	Empathy (Noun) Definition: The ability to understand and share the feelings of another. Example: Empathy is a key aspect of World Kindness Day, as people are encouraged to put themselves in others' shoes.
Thursday:	Compassion (Noun) <i>Definition:</i> Sympathetic pity and concern for the sufferings or misfortunes of others. <i>Example:</i> Acts of compassion are celebrated on World Kindness Day.
Friday: Children in Need	Beneficiary (Noun) <i>Definition:</i> A person who derives advantage from something, especially a trust, will, or life insurance policy. <i>Example:</i> The charity event aims to provide support to every beneficiary in need of assistance.

Job of the Week: Sound Engineer

What Qualifications do you need to do this job?

There are no set entry requirements, but you'll need a good knowledge of music and recording technology. You may also find it useful to understand physics and electronics

What does a Sound Engineer do?

Day-to-day duties might involve:

- planning recording sessions with producers and artists
- setting up microphones and equipment in the studio
- making sure the volume and recording levels are set correctly
- operating recording equipment and adding effects
- mixing tracks to produce a final 'master' track

Make your lunch and drink if you bring a packed lunch to school






Turn off devices half an hour before bedtime
