Report Remove

Report Remove is a partnership between Childline and the Internet Watch Foundation which helps children to confidentially report sexual images and videos of themselves; and have them removed from the internet. Children can select their age range on the Childline website and follow the instructions to make a report. Transition Information

From Monday 8th July:

- Students in Year 9 become Year 10 and their day will be 8.30am until 3pm.
- Students in Year 10 become Year 11 and their day will finish at 3.30pm.

Year 9, KS4 students will transition to the Upper Academy on Monday 8th July. All their lessons will be taught at BUA for the last two weeks of this academic year in readiness for 2024-5.

Absence Procedures

To report a student absence please visit the <u>Contact Us</u> page via the Basildon Upper Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)

Academies Celebrates Pool's Grand Reopening with Paralympic Gold Medallist

The Basildon Academies Trust celebrated the grand opening of its newly refurbished Lower Academy swimming pool on June 24th, continuing its commitment to providing top-tier facilities for its students and the local community.

The refurbishment project, which took six months to complete, boasts state-of-the-art facilities and eco-friendly features. The project, undertaken by swimming pool specialists Centurion Leisure and construction company Herronway Ltd, included extensive upgrades to both the pool and the changing areas.



Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony with Paralympian Danny Crates

The highlight of the event was the ribbon-cutting ceremony led by Paralympian Gold Medallist Danny Crates. A fully qualified diving instructor, Crates not only formally opened the pool but also engaged with students in an inspiring talk and Q&A session. His presence added a touch of prestige to the celebration, motivating students and guests with his story of perseverance and success.

Job of the Week: Fashion Designer

What does a Fashion Designer do?

Fashion designers design and make clothing for clothing companies, retailers, and manufacturers. You'll often work closely with garment technologists and sample machinists. You'll work to design instructions (a 'brief'), analysing or predicting trends in fabrics, colours and shapes. You could also work with manufacturers (often based overseas) to make sure that designs are reproduced accurately.

What Qualifications do you need to do this job?

You'll usually need a relevant higher education qualification, like a foundation degree, diploma, or degree. It might be helpful to study a course that teaches design and technical skills; look for accredited colleges or courses who belong to your country's fashion council. You'll often start as a design assistant before working your way up to a full designer role.
