These assessments are set and marked internally. Result data will be used to support learning, set targets and continue to monitor progress.

All students will receive a personalised timetable with the details for assessments; including date, venue, time and seat number. Timetables should be kept safe to refer to during the week.

Results of these assessments will be shared with students on Thursday. Parents and carers will have the opportunity to speak to teachers about next steps at the upcoming Progress Review Event on Wednesday 22nd January.

You will learn basic theories or ways of looking at society and develop the skills to assess different views and reach conclusions. You will expand and use knowledge to analyse modern society, critically assess different views on the way society works, explore the core themes of socialisation, culture and identity, social differentiation, and power and stratification.

Thriving as an External Student: My Story at the Basildon Upper Academy Sixth Form

Enrolling in the right Sixth Form is a crucial decision in preparing for your future. Whilst many students choose to attend their Secondary School's sixth form, many others – myself included – decided to make a fresh start in a brandnew school. Certainly, a daunting decision, but what does the life of an external student look like?

Having no previous connection with Basildon Upper Academy and with no enrolled acquaintances, I had no idea what to expect, what the staff were like or if I would even form friendships. As a special educational needs (SEN) student, my experiences within education settings haven't always been positive. Fears of ostracisation will always be present when you're different and starting in a new environment. Basildon Upper Academy was my first time in a mainstream education setting since primary school, so I was not only faced with the inevitable changes that come with being an external student but also changes to how I've grown to know education entirely.



The staff have offered a warm welcome to myself and the amazing people I get to call my friends. Whenever support is required, I have faced no issues in receiving it, whether this be class related or personal. Students are swiftly notified of opportunities which will assist them once they leave sixth form, such as UCAS events, apprenticeships or workshops.

Life at Basildon Upper Academy has a unique take on traditional school timetables. We sit all timetabled hours for a subject in one day, leading most students to only have 3 days in school on their timetables. The exclusive timetable structure allows for a fantastic school/personal life balance, efficiently learning whilst enjoying our youth simultaneously. Personally, this timetable structure was a contributing factor to my application for Basildon Upper Academy. My friends at the school and I often use these free days to spend time with each other, revising together and strengthening the school community in doing so!

Amongst all else, Basildon Upper Academy offers equal opportunities to all students, no matter your educational or personal background. Here, I felt I was truly able to prove myself for my abilities, rather than being held back by my past, the latter being an issue I faced when looking into other sixth forms. My future and aspirations are clear and achievable since I enrolled in Basildon Upper Academy.

13 th - 17 th January 2025 Energy Saving Week RSPB School Garden Watch (16 th -30 th Jan)	
Monday:	Sustainability (Noun) Definition: The ability to be maintained at a certain rate or level, especially without depleting resources or causing severe damage. Example: Energy Saving Week emphasizes the importance of sustainability in reducing our environmental impact.
Tuesday:	Conservation (Noun) Definition: The action of conserving something, in this case, energy, by avoiding waste. Example: Effective energy conservation measures can significantly reduce household energy consumption.
Wednesday:	Efficiency (Noun) Definition: The state or quality of being efficient, in this case, using less energy to achieve the same result. Example:: Improving the efficiency of appliances can lead to substantial energy savings during Energy Saving Week.
Thursday:	Biodiversity (Noun) Definition: The variety of plant and animal life in a particular habitat, often regarded as important and desirable. Example: Monitoring biodiversity in school gardens helps students understand the importance of maintaining diverse ecosystems.
Friday:	Ecology (Noun) Definition: The branch of biology that deals with the relations of organisms to one another and to their physical surroundings. Example: The RSPB School Garden Watch provides an opportunity for students to explore basic principles of ecology.

To report a student absence please visit the Contact Us page via the Basildon Upper Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parent/carers may be asked for medical evidence to support absences after 3 days or reoccurring absence patterns.
- Wherever possible, parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours. If this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
