Job of the Week: Geochemist

What does a Geochemist do?

A geochemist is a scientist who studies the chemical composition and processes of the Earth and other planets1. They use principles of chemistry, physics, and geology to understand the Earth's structure, composition, and evolution, as well as its natural resources such as minerals, oil and gas, and water. You may analyse the age, conduct sample tests and work with a range of specialist equipment.

What Qualifications do you need to do this job?

To become a geochemist, you need at least a primary degree in a related subject, such as geology, physical/environmental chemistry, or chemical/mineral engineering. An undergraduate degree in geochemistry, geology, environmental sciences, chemical engineering or a related subject is required for this career choice. Some careers in industry may not require an advanced degree

To report a student absence please visit the Contact Us page via the Basildon Upper Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)
