The expedition began with a comprehensive training day, where our adventurers learned essential outdoor skills. The group mastered the art of packing their rucksacks, pitching tents, cooking with gas stoves, and navigating using a compass and map, among other crucial survival techniques.

Following their training, the students embarked on the assessed portion of their expedition. This phase put their newly acquired skills to the test as they navigated their route and managed their camp independently, all while working cohesively as a team.

What Qualifications do you need to do this job?

You'll need a high level of dance training and experience. Most choreographers start as professional dancers and many study dance at college or university.

You can often become an assistant choreographer after being a dance captain, who leads and rehearses other dancers but does not create the steps.



Absence Procedures

To report a student absence please visit the <u>Contact Us</u> page via the Basildon Upper Academy website and select the option for Attendance.
